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ACTIVITIES FOR QUARTER ENDED 30 September 2023

- Mt Lucky heritage survey results received.
- Meekatharra Gold Project aircore drilling results received.
- Mt Forrest Shared Infrastructure Study, to understand the economics of developing shared infrastructure to transport magnetite ore from the Mid-West of WA to the coast, continues with AGIG and Verbrec.
- Development opportunities for the Mt Forrest Iron Project and identification of alternative joint venture partners continue.



MT LUCKY GOLD PROJECT (MDX 100%)

The Mt Lucky Gold Project (**Mt Lucky**), tenement E38/3336, lies within the Mt Margaret Mineral Field of the north-eastern Goldfields of Western Australia (Laverton Greenstone Belt), approximately 7km east of the Granny Smith gold mine (plant capacity 3.5 Mtpa) and 12 km southeast of Laverton. The ground has widespread gold anomalism and artisanal-scale gold workings.

The results of a heritage survey, completed over the tenement area during June 2023, were received after the end of the September 2023 quarter. The scope was to review existing heritage survey reports and conduct a comprehensive ACH survey over the project area. The work included a desktop study and an 'on-the-ground survey'/inspection of the area in collaboration with the relevant Traditional Owners of the area. This work was undertaken over a period where new legislation governing the protection of Aboriginal cultural heritage came into force and was then subsequently repealed. The report confirmed the project areas have been fully surveyed and no additional heritage surveys are required for the proposed exploration programme. One new potential site of cultural significance (ACH) was identified during the survey with the area to be demarcated and avoided during the exploration program.

The receipt of the survey results now allows for the proposed drilling programme to be initiated to test prospective structures for signs of gold mineralisation. A 3,000m RC drilling programme has been designed to test the most prospective of these structures with drilling scheduled to be completed during the December quarter.

The Company will continue to closely monitor the ever-evolving regulation with respect to cultural heritage and ensure the planned exploration programme is undertaken in accordance with the regulations in force from time to time.

MEEKATHARRA GOLD PROJECT (MDX 100%)

The Meekatharra Gold Project (**Meekatharra North**), tenement E51/1705, lies within the Murchison Gold Field of Western Australia, approximately 40km north of Meekatharra and 2km south of the Andy Well Gold Mine (currently on care and maintenance).

During the September Quarter the results of an aircore drilling programme, undertaken during May 2023, were received. The programme was designed to test geophysical targets defined by the previously completed Sub Audio Magnetic (SAM) survey in order to identify any near surface indicators of gold anomalism.

Although no significant results were returned from the program an anomaly of approximately 300m long by 150m wide was identified as requiring follow up. The presence of this anomaly provides encouragement that the basement rocks may have the potential to host primary gold mineralisation. Interpretation of the results of the programme is ongoing.

A systematic exploration programme along this structure will be developed to determine if it contains economic widths of gold mineralisation in the fresh bedrock at depth.

The remaining undrilled SAM targets will also be assessed and the subject of aircore drilling to determine their prospectivity.



MT FORREST IRON PROJECT (MDX 65.0%)

The Mt Forrest Iron Project is operated via a joint venture between Mindax, Yilgiron Pty Ltd (**Yilgiron**), and Norton Gold Fields Pty Ltd (**Norton**) pursuant to a shareholders agreement dated 22 July 2021 (**SHA**).

Mindax, as Manager of the joint venture is reviewing further development opportunities for Mt Forrest, including (subject to the SHA) seeking alternative joint venture partners to assist with development.

Lithium potential reviewed.

A soil sampling programme consisting of 237 samples was completed during the quarter to test the surrounding basement granite on the western side of the BIF range for any signs of lithium anomalism. Assay results have been returned from this programme with no anomalous samples identified and no further work is planned at this stage.

MT FORREST SHARED INFRASTRUCTURE - AUSTRALIAN GAS INFRASTRUCTURE GROUP (MDX 100%)

On 9 November 2022 the Company announced the execution of a heads of agreement (**HOA**) with AGI Operations Pty Ltd (a company within the Australian Gas Infrastructure Group of companies) (**AGIG**) to understand the commercial viability of development of infrastructure, including power and water, for the export of iron ore in the form of magnetite, from the Mid-West Region of Western Australia.

The parties agreed to commission Verbrec Limited to prepare studies in three phases: Phase one is a Scoping Study (**Scoping Study**); phase two is a Pre-Feasibility Study (**PFS**) on the viability of developing infrastructure which will allow Yilgiron, and other miners in the Mid-West, to transport magnetite ore to port and to be loaded onto a ship for export. Phase three will be a Detailed Feasibility Study.

The PFS is anticipated to be completed during the December 2023 quarter.

TENURE

A total of 9 tenements covering more than 70 km² were held as at 30 September 2023. A list of the tenements and their locations are detailed in Annexure "A".

CORPORATE

The Company continues to review project acquisition opportunities and to date the Company has not proceeded to acquire any further projects. Reviews are ongoing and will continue during the coming quarters.

On 23 June 2023, the Company entered into an agreement with Mr Yueguang Huang, an unrelated individual, to introduce parties to the Company to raise up to \$6.6 million on a bestendeavours basis through the issue of fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company at an issue price per share to be not less than 80% of the volume weighted average price of the Company's ordinary shares traded on ASX over the 25 trading days immediately before the issue price is agreed. The compensation arrangements in relation to this agreement were amended to reduce the commission rate from 5% to 3% and increase the number of options to be issued



to the Huang Team upon completion to 180M at an exercise price of \$0.07 and expiring on the date that is 12 months after the successful completion of the capital raising.

As at the date of this report, no commitments or funds have been received in relation to this capital raising endeavour.

Strategy

The Company's strategy is to realise shareholder value exploring its existing projects with the view to potentially delivering new discoveries, continuing to pursue new opportunities, and seeking to amalgamate holdings through acquisition and corporate activity.

Capital Structure

The issued capital of the Company is 2,045,558,780 fully paid ordinary shares, 37,000,000 unlisted options (exercise price \$0.08, expiring 16 November 2023) and 10,000,000 unlisted options (exercise price \$0.07 expiring 25 October 2024).

ASX Additional Information

ASX Listing Rule 5.3.1: Exploration and evaluation expenditure during the quarter was \$1,097,000 comprising payments associated with the HOA with AGIG, tenement compliance costs and geological consulting costs associated with the Meekatharra, Mt Lucky and Mt Forrest gold projects.

ASX Listing Rule 5.3.2: There were no mining production and development activities undertaken during the quarter.

ASX Listing Rule 5.3.5: During the quarter, the Company made cash payments totalling \$192,000 to related parties or their associates. This was the aggregate amount paid to the directors including salary, directors' fees, consulting fees and superannuation.
